Letter from the CEO

Dear Fellow Tilters,

Enclosed is our first-ever annual report, and what a milestone year it represents for Tilting Futures. Inside, you'll see the incredible progress we've made: shattering application records, building a mounting evidence base of efficacy, launching recruitment for two new programs, and seeing unprecedented inbound partnership interest.

Here's where we're making moves in 2025:

ANSWERING THE CALL FOR MORE ACCESS

- "If only you had a summer option!", is one of the most common requests our recruitment team hears. Now, we do. Applications for our new June Accelerator program in South Africa are pouring in, and to meet demand, we're exploring a second site in Malaysia for 2026.
- We're also hearing growing interest in an All-Girls track to equip young women, still underrepresented in STEM, with the skills and networks to lead. As we explore this idea, we're actively gathering input from students and partners.

PROVING OUR IMPACT, RAISING THE BAR

- Research results continue to exceed expectations, showing statistically significant gains in student learning, even as study rigor increases.
- In 2025, we'll launch our first randomized control trial, a major step in proving impact at the highest standard. This progress is made possible by our incredible applicants and the support of funders committed to building the strongest possible evidence base, the foundation for our systems change work.

MAKING REAL-WORLD LEARNING COUNT IN HIGHER EDUCATION

- The initial response from higher education demonstrates the growing appetite for integrating Take Action Lab into degree pathways, with the Bonner Foundation, Morehouse College, Rhodes College, and the University of Oregon Honors College already on board as partners.
- We're progressing rapidly with two leading institutions as first-movers in offering Take Action Lab for credit. At the same time, we're developing a playbook for additional universities eager to integrate our program into their degree pathways, providing a scalable model to accelerate adoption.

YOUR ROLE IN WHAT COMES NEXT

I hope that as you read through this report, you see your fingerprints across our accomplishments and our plans. This work is only possible because of supporters like you: funders, partners, and advocates who push us to think bigger and bolder about what is possible for young people and education.










Our Approach

BEGINNING HIS JOURNEY

Luiz Gustavo knew that connecting with people from different backgrounds was critical to gaining the global perspective he needed to become an ethical, human-centered technology leader. To supplement his university studies, he joined Take Action Lab in February 2024.

IMMERSED IN CAPE TOWN

After traveling from Brazil to Cape Town, Luiz joined a class of 50 young people with world-changing potential. "By the end of the first day, it's like we were family. We all wanted to learn how we could promote peace. It was life-changing, even at the earliest moments."

During Take Action Lab, Luiz apprenticed with the Refugee Legal and Advocacy Centre, where he gained firsthand experience in connecting law, politics, and technology. "As an information systems major, all my courses are focused on technology and coding. But there's so much more you need to understand about the systems that create disparities to use technology for good."

PATHWAY TO NEW PERSPECTIVES

Now back in Brazil, Luiz is resuming his studies with a new focus on leveraging technology for social impact. "I don't just want to be 'the coding guy.' I want to use technology to create positive change in the world by exploring new use-cases for AI and, eventually, creating my own digital literacy initiatives."

Expanding Programs to Meet Student Demand

Demand for Take Action Lab has been unprecedented, with over 18,000 students in our application pipeline, reflecting a surging interest and growing need for real-world learning experiences.

Thanks to your generous support, we unveiled two new programs in 2024: Take Action Lab: Environment & Sustainability, and Take Action Lab Accelerator: Human Rights.

These efforts will help us serve more students than ever before, 2.5x more next year alone, on our path to a 5x increase over the next five years.

BEGINNING HER JOURNEY

Rutendo Kahari, a native of Bulawayo, Zimbabwe, always wanted to make the world a better place. As a future pre-med student, she also knew that to become the kind of doctor she wanted to be, she needed more than top-notch medical training. She needed a global perspective and real world experience, one that would allow her to bridge the gaps in healthcare she had witnessed firsthand.

This propelled her to join Take Action Lab: Human Rights in 2023. There, she recognized that ensuring access to medical care must go hand in hand with promoting scientific literacy. "Take Action Lab was transformative, one of the greatest experiences of my life. It taught me to share my knowledge and inspired me to help others explore the wonders of science."

PATHWAY TO NEW BREAKTHROUGHS

After her program, Rutendo moved to Minnesota to study biochemistry at the College of St. Scholastica, where she is researching how bacteria-fighting phage viruses can be used to treat diseases like tuberculosis. Most recently, she was selected by the United Nations Foundation to serve as a United to Beat Malaria College Ambassador, where she's presented to fellow students and to state politicians to secure research funding for malaria.

Rutendo's ultimate goal is to ensure that life-saving medical treatments are globally accessible. "Tilting Futures made me realize just how deeply connected we all are. Now, it's my hope that I and many others will be part of the global community that shares medical breakthroughs with everyone."

Systems Impact: Advancing Research to Share the Future of Global Education

Tilting Futures is setting the standard for data-driven and evidence-based innovation in global education.

Our research and evaluation efforts are creating a solid evidence base for a completely new way of learning. Through randomized control trials, cohort studies, case control studies, and robust qualitative research, we are advancing an innovative educational model that blends hands-on learning, cultural immersion, and reflective practice to launch tomorrow's world-changers.

With your support, we can continue our work to ensure that the impact of our programs is proven and measurable — building a new evidence base to demonstrate the impact of this innovative approach to global learning.

NEW INSIGHTS INTO LONG-TERM PROGRAM OUTCOMES

Each term, students in our Take Action Lab program participate in longitudinal cohort studies designed to help us understand how they are growing and changing throughout the course of the program.

Recently, UC Berkeley researchers analyzed this data and found that students grew, by a statistically significant margin, in the following areas:













UC Berkeley researchers also independently conducted the first-ever control-group analysis of our program outcomes.

Their findings revealed that our alumni gain the essential skills, mindsets, and cultural competencies, such as empathy, global orientation, and cross-cultural collaboration, to thrive in an interconnected global workforce and drive cross-sector change. Our alumni outperformed their matched peers in having:

01

A better **understanding of themselves** and their **cultural foundations**.

02

Stronger sense of membership and commitment to the global community.

03

Reduced prejudicial attitudes.

04

Higher likelihood of pursuing **careers** that create **positive social impact** in the world.





We found that program participation is associated with increased self-awareness, a stronger sense of interconnectedness, reduced prejudicial attitudes, and a greater motivation to pursue careers in the social enterprise sectors. These findings offer encouraging signs of how Tilting Futures may be shaping its students into global citizens."

BUILDING HER FUTURE

Months after leaving India, Alex drew from her Tilting Futures experience and volunteered at a refugee camp in Greece to support children and families displaced by global conflict.

After this, she attended Tufts University where she studied International Relations and Arabic. While at Tufts, she secured funding to research children's play in refugee camps and spent a year abroad in Jordan, a decision she made without hesitation because of Tilting Futures. "I wouldn't have chosen to do a full year in Jordan if it hadn't been for my Fellowship! The lessons I learned by stepping out of my comfort zone and embracing different communities prepared me for the exact kind of work I realized was my calling."

PATHWAY TO GLOBAL SERVICE

After graduating in 2023, Alex was selected as a Volunteers in Asia (VIA) Global Community Fellow in Chiang Mai, Thailand, where she serves as an academic advisor at Parami University, an online school providing college education to displaced students. Her Fellowship experience helped her find her voice and solidify her commitment to expanding educational opportunities for others. "Now, I want to make sure students everywhere have opportunities to grow to their full potential so that the world can become a more kind and compassionate place."

Unlocking New Pathways for Global Service

At Tilting Futures, we believe that service is not just an act, it's a way of life. Young people are seeking meaning, purpose, and the chance to contribute to something greater than themselves. BEGINNING HER JOURNEY

Like many high school students, Dena Muething felt uncertain about her future. A strong student with numerous interests, Dena saw college as both a necessary step and as something she wanted to approach with greater intention.

Dena found Tilting Futures' Global Citizen Year Fellowship Program. "I liked the Fellowship program because it was the exact mix of service, immersion, and hands-on experience I was looking for," Dena shared.

IMMERSED IN ECUADOR

During her Fellowship, Dena lived in the Sierra region of Ecuador and did an educational apprenticeship teaching English. This time gave her space to connect her interests to impact while determining her future. "I realized that I loved the intersection of education and environmental issues. So, in college, I majored in environmental studies with a focus on education."

PATHWAY TO NEW BREAKTHROUGHS

After college, Dena joined the Peace Corps, and is currently serving in Panama. "I'm a community environmental conservationist working directly with community members and local government. I teach environmental science at the local school, and I'm also working on organic pest control for crops, setting up a tree nursery, and helping install eco-stoves in people's homes."



That's why we're partnering with the Clinton Global Initiative University (CGI-U) to offer alumni spots in CGI-U's 2025 cohort, gaining access to world-class education, global networks, and the opportunity to continue building real-world skills to drive social impact.

Leadership as Practice, Not Position: Jiayuan's Story



BEGINNING HIS JOURNEY

Jiayuan Tian always viewed education as a pathway to empowerment. Seeking a deeper intercultural connection to expand his worldview and supplement his university education, Jiayuan joined Tilting Futures' Global Citizen Year Academy.

CREATING GLOBAL CONNECTIONS

Thanks to a generous Tilting Futures donor, Jiayuan received an Enlight Foundation Scholarship to attend the Academy. "My Tilting Futures experience reshaped how I see the world. I met young people who were from places so different from where I grew up, but who shared the same passion for creating change."

PATHWAY TO GLOBAL RECOGNITION

Motivated by his newfound perspective, Jiayuan founded the Tilting Futures Chinese Media Center, a resource hub that connects young people to global learning programs to support intercultural exchange and inspire students on their educational journeys. He later co-founded OneXplore, a social enterprise advancing international education and fostering cross-cultural exchanges among youth from diverse backgrounds.

Today, as he prepares to graduate from college, Jiayuan's efforts are being recognized on the global stage.

Founder of the Chinese Media Center, Co-founder of OneXplore, and Diana Award Recipient Tilting Futures nominated him for the Diana Award — a prestigious award given to young changemakers in honor of the late Princess Diana of Wales.
